Franks Trap Report: As of September 1st, the league took in \$12064.00 of which \$1857.60 was deposited in the Trap Fund and \$206.40 was deposited into the Trap Equipment Fund. This resulted in an estimated "profit" of about \$818 to the club. Shooting for the season is up to just over 20 rounds per week.

August was a great month for our shooters. There were 7 perfect rounds shot during the month. Mike Galusha was in fine form shooting 25's on August 2nd, 9th, 16th and 30th. Also shooting 25's was Jerry Seyboth on the 2nd and Steve Smith and Jackson Ciavardoni (his first 25) on the 16th. Over 70% of the rounds shot in August were 20 or higher. WOW!

One of our regular shooters, Grayson Weil, brought his cousin, Steve Shenfield, to shoot with us on August 9th. Steve had never fired a shotgun but had experience with .22's in his youth. Grayson and I provided the usual safety talk and some very basic information on things like foot position and hold points. Steve then proceeded to break 24 of the 25 birds we threw for him! At first, I thought this was the result of a lot of luck. Steve followed up his 24 with two rounds of 21. He qualified as the best novice shooter I've ever seen.
